

Beginning this year, our Stewardship program will be switching to a three-year commitment cycle for 2020-2023. So, please plan ahead and decide on the Ministries that you would like to get involved in. On your Stewardship Intention Card, sign up for those Ministries/Committees/Events that you wish to begin, along with those you wish to continue for the next three years.

ADMINISTRATION / LEADERSHIP (Appointed Positions)

1. PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council is responsible for the vision of the parish community and acts as an advisory committee to the Pastor. Meetings are normally held the fourth Tuesday of the month from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm in the Community Room with an annual day retreat held on a Saturday in July. Length of commitment is 3 years. (1 year for Alternates).

2. FINANCE COUNCIL

This Council provides the administration of the parish finances, preparation and administration of the parish operating budget and capital funds, long-range financial planning of the parish resources, and approves major capital spending. It also reviews financial audits and recommends changes to ensure financial integrity. A prompt return of your Time, Talent and Treasure Intention form will enable this committee to accurately budget for the current fiscal year.

BOOSTER CLUB / ATHLETICS

3. BOOSTER CLUB

The Booster Club promotes, sponsors & maintains sports activity for Notre Dame Academy and St. Lawrence parishioners. This club hosts events/leagues raising money to maintain the St. Lawrence athletic facilities and fund the Notre Dame sports programs. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

4. COACHING

Coaches and assistant coaches are needed for all sports teams. Coaches must submit a resume to the Booster Club for consideration. All interested persons must have a background check and attend the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Training class. Length of commitment depends on the length of the season.

FORMATION — Bill Unruh

5. FORMATION COMMITTEE

Bill Unruh 448-2122

Lifelong Formation and Education Committee is responsible for providing Catholic religious education and formation opportunities for our parish community. Persons are needed to represent different ages and groups in the parish. Length of commitment is three years.

6. CHILDREN'S CHURCH

Children's Church (Children's Liturgy of the Word) is held during the 10:30 am Sunday Mass. Children ages 4 through grade 3 are invited to explore the Gospel each Sunday (Sept. – May). Catechists are needed to discuss the Gospel with the children, using leaflets provided. Time commitment is about once a month from September through May.

7. RCIA

Bill Unruh 448-2122

RCIA is an acronym for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and is the way we welcome unbaptized adults and those baptized in another Christian tradition into the Catholic Church. The process consists of various stages of experience and ritual celebrations. As an individual progresses in faith toward full initiation through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, he or she is supported by a sponsor, guided by catechists (both lay and ordained) and embraced by our community of believers. See the following for descriptions of the RCIA opportunities available.

There are a number of ways to help with RCIA if you are interested in serving with RCIA contact Bill Unruh.

8. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: CATECHISTS & AIDES Bill Unruh 448-2122

This program assists parents in the religious education and formation of their children who attend public schools. Catechists (teachers of religion) are needed for grades K – 8. These persons are to be practicing Catholics and are to take classes provided by the Archdiocese of Louisville.

St. Lawrence participates with three other parishes in DiCaFF (Dixie Catholic Faith Formation). Classes are held Wednesday evenings, 6:30 – 8:00 p.m. at Incarnation Formation Center for K-6th grade and 6:15 - 7:45 at St. Paul for 7th and 8th grade. Length of commitment is the time to prepare lessons and ninety minutes on Wednesday evenings from September – April.

GROUNDS & MAINTENANCE

9. PLANNING & MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE

CHAIRPERSON NEEDED

Provides the information and recommendations for the upkeep and general maintenance of our parish grounds and buildings. Volunteers with plumbing, electrical, carpentry, masonry, HVAC and painting skills are needed. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

10. GRASS CUTTING / LANDSCAPING

Matt Rasche 640-0137

Volunteers are needed to help with the beautification of parish grounds during grass cutting season. Six teams are rotated each week. Mowers are provided by St. Lawrence or may be brought from home. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

OUTREACH

11. BEREAVEMENT MEALS

Bill Unruh 448-2122

After the funeral Mass at St. Lawrence a meal is offered to the family of the deceased. Volunteers prepare food at home and bring it to the Community Room the morning of the funeral Mass. Other volunteers set up the meal, serve it and clean up afterwards. We currently have three groups with a four-month length of commitment per year.

12. NURSING HOME MINISTRY / HOMEBOUND MINISTRY **Bill Unruh 448-2122**

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist take Holy Communion to the elderly and other homebound members within the parish. This ministry is provided each Friday, or if preferred, another day of the week according to the needs of the minister or homebound person.

Eucharistic Ministers take Holy Communion to Catholic residents of Signature-Rockford Manor Nursing Home Each Sunday. Mass is celebrated the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month at 10:30 a.m. Communion Services are celebrated on alternate Tuesdays. Volunteers provide assistance to residents who attend. St. Lawrence has parishioners in other nursing facilities who would appreciate visitors from our parish.

13. ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCE

Gerry Sims, Chairman 995-3356

This organization, in a spirit of justice & charity, helps those who are suffering by person-to-person involvement of its members. Volunteers take calls from clients who need various forms of help from food to bills. Meetings are held the first Wednesday of every month. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

PARISH LIFE

14. STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE / WELCOMING COMMITTEE

Coordinates, creates and maintains the process that enables parishioners in Stewardship of time, talent and treasure. Volunteers needed to assist with year-long planning, updating stewardship brochure and presentation plan and follow-up of time/talent volunteers. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

15. COLLECTION COUNTER

Joyce Nelson 448-2122

Volunteers are needed to help count and record the Sunday collection. This task is performed on Monday mornings in the Parish Office. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

SCOUTS

16. BOY SCOUTS is an organization for boys age 10 and over. They meet every Wednesday. Interested adults are always needed and greatly enhance our program by working directly with the boys or by serving on the committee which is charged with assessing troop needs. Many volunteer positions are available.

17. CUB SCOUTS is for boys ages 5 to 9. They meet every Tuesday.

20. WORSHIP COMMITTEE

The Worship Committee consists of members of all of our liturgical ministries and provides direction and planning for the liturgies and environment throughout the year. Length of Commitment is up to the individual.

21. ALTAR SERVERS

David Maxwell 314-7120

DeeDee Nauert 376-7418

Altar servers assist the priest during weekend Masses and special liturgies , i.e. Christmas, Easter, funerals, etc. Servers can begin the program in the 5th grade and continue as long as desired . Servers will be scheduled only for the Mass of their choice. There is a training class before you are scheduled. Once trained, you will be scheduled with an experienced server your first couple of times on the schedule. Includes monthly meetings, Server of the Month and a point system with quarterly rewards. Any Adults who wish to Serve at funerals, call the Parish Office at 448-2122 for scheduling a training session and practice.

22. ART & ENVIRONMENT

The Art & Environment committee's mission is to complement our liturgical season with the decoration of the church. Volunteers are needed during the Christmas, Easter, all other Holy Days and related liturgical events. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

23. CHURCH CLEANING

Joyce Nelson 448-2122

We have 4 teams that make up our church cleaning ministry. Each week, usually on Thursdays (before our weekend masses) the team will gather to dust, sweep and vacuum the church and chapel. Special cleanings for Christmas & Easter. Volunteers are scheduled yearly. This is a great family ministry to get the kids involved! Having 4 teams - Your team will usually clean once a month.

24. EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Jerry Yates 681-5689

These ministers perform a special function for the parish family. Ministers assist the priest by presenting the Body and Blood of Christ during Holy Communion at Mass. Ministers also take Holy Communion to those unable to attend Mass. New ministers must attend two 2-hour training sessions conducted by the Archdiocese's Office of Worship. Length of commitment is up to the individual. You will receive a mandate card from the Archdiocese good for 5 years. At the end of the 5 years you must take a 2-hour refresher course for a new mandate card.

25. FUNERAL MINISTERS

Karen Kuenzig 448-2122

Ministers are needed to serve in various ministry roles during funerals. Funerals take place mostly on weekdays and usually at 10 a.m. There is an occasional Saturday morning funeral. Worship Director will contact ministers as needed as soon as family has met with worship director to plan the liturgy.

26. GIFT BEARER

This ministry presents the bread, wine and tithing to the Priest during the offertory part of the Mass. This is done at all weekend Masses and/or special liturgies. You will be scheduled only at the Mass of your choice. Length of commitment is up to the individual. This is a wonderful family ministry.

27. HOSPITALITY

This ministry provides information and service to those attending Mass or other services in Church. Ministers are stationed at the front and side doors to welcome those attending, distribute bulletins, straighten church after services, etc.

WORSHIP (CONTINUED)

28. LECTOR

A Minister of the Word enhances the liturgical experience by presenting the word of God in a clear and concise manner. Length of commitment is up to the individual and includes practice time in preparation for assigned Mass or other service.

29. NURSERY (10:00 a.m. SUNDAY)

Marie Gonterman 445-8819

This ministry provides child care during the 10 a.m. Sunday Mass for children 4 and under. The nursery is located in the Science room across from the Chapel of Our Lady in the school building. This is a good volunteer opportunity for service hours. Length of commitment is up to the individual. This is a good family ministry.

30. SACRISTAN

Marilyn McNeill 819-6131

This ministry is responsible for training new sacristans on the proper set up for all liturgical services. This is an excellent family ministry. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

31. USHER

Tim Rasche 640-3603

This ministry collects the offerings at each weekend Mass and/or special liturgies. Also at special Masses, the usher will be asked to help hospitality with seating, if need be. This ministry is open to male, female, young and not-so-young, and school children, sixth grade and up. You will be scheduled only at the Mass of your choice. This is a wonderful family ministry. Length of commitment is up to the individual.

32. CAMERA OPERATOR

This minister will work with camera and computer equipment to livestream our Sunday Mass. Other needs may be videotaping weddings, funerals, baptisms or other church related events. On rotation for one Sunday a month.

WORSHIP / MUSIC

Music Ministry is multi-faceted and is an integral part of our worship. The principal musicians for our liturgies are the members of the Assembly; but to assist this singing body of Christ, instrumentalists, cantors, choirs, etc. are needed. Please see the listings in this music section for the categories of music currently used in our parish community and the music opportunities available.

33. BEREAVEMENT CHOIR

The Resurrection Choir is for anyone available to sing at a Funeral during the day.

34. CANTOR

Cantors lead the congregation in singing at the weekend Masses and special liturgies. New Cantors will be auditioned by the Music Director. Cantors must also be members of the Choir.

35. CHILDREN'S CHOIR

The Children's choir presents the opportunity for mature children of all ages to present music for Mass. Contact the Music Director for interest in this wonderful opportunity.

36. ADULT CHOIR

The Adult Choir sings throughout the year. This Choir rehearses every Thursday at 7 p.m.

37. INSTRUMENTALISTS

Musicians are welcome to play various instruments at weekend liturgies and special services.
